### **Most Frequently Recorded**

Sword-Bearing Conehead

Neoconocephalus ensiger

With its loud back-and-forth, this katydid was recorded everywhere from Deer Grove to Busse Woods to Cap Sauers Holding.

## **Most Challenging to Identify**

Meadow Katydids

Genus Orchelimum

Several monitors submitted recordings of meadow katydids, some with very soft or difficult to discern songs. Some of you are getting the hang of it! And we can practice more on monitor song walks in 2020.



Linne's and Scissor-Grinder Cicadas Genus Neotibicen

You're out there trying to record a delicate cricket hiding

somewhere in the leaf litter, and who insists on drowning all the other males out? Linne's and Scissor-Grinder Cicadas. But give them a break, things are going to get hard for them once the 17-year cicadas emerge.


